32 of Nick Hemann. Mr. Hemann furnished a prescription drug to a student athlete who
33 had not been prescribed the drug. He received a sanction of: public reprimand, a

1 suspension of his license for two years, completion of a 15-hour in-person ethics
2 course, completion of a medication management course, and he agreed not to
3 administer medication, supplements, or other substances for five years. Mr. Hemann
4 has completed all requirements and requests. Mr. Hemann made a reinstatement
5 request at a previous meeting and the board denied his request. At this meeting, the
6 board was provided a letter from Mr. Hemann. Board members were split on the
7 decision. Some felt that the additional letter didn't state what he did and that he
8 wasn't remorseful for his actions. He didn't indicate what he learned or mention the
9 danger to the student involved. Others stated that he did complete the necessary
10 requirements of the settlement agreement. Kristen Rickey moved, with a second by
11 Kathy Behrens, that in **case number 19-17**, the Board grant the respondent's
12 request for reinstatement and issue an order stating that the basis for the suspension
13 no longer exists and it will be in the public interest for the license to be reinstated.
14 Roll call vote: Behrens – yes; Bleam – no; Harper – no; Janzen – yes; McKinney – yes;
15 Rickey – yes; St Clair – no; Schoening – yes; Voss - no. **MOTION CARRIED.**

26 Executive Director's Report

27 Legislative Update:

28 Joanne Tubbs, Nicole Proesch and Executive Director Cavin (Cavin) met with
29 Representative Wheeler regarding license renewal credit offerings from other agencies
30 as well as the ethics violation process.

31

1 We have had some requests from a couple of legislators who would like to continue the
2 discussion of board actions. Cavin will inform the board when this meeting takes
3 place.

4
5 Still uncertain regarding the 2023 legislative agenda at this time.

6
7 Agency Update:

8 Board Secretary Kim Cunningham will be retiring at the end of this year. Cavin is
9 working with DAS as far as posting the position, interviewing, etc.

10
11 We are continuing to see an increase in the number of requests to fill vacant positions
12 with a substitute. Currently, we received 301 requests which is up from 275 last
13 month. The majority of the requests have been approved.

14
15 We have spent the last several months working on our website. It had to be updated
16 to a new platform. The new website will be rolled out in November. This will not be
17 the last revision as we will need to make modifications once the State has adopted a
18 new universal image. The updates we have done should be easily transferred over to
19 the new image.

20
21 Licensure Update:

22 September was the second highest September with the number of licenses issued in
23 the last 10 years (3,840).

24
25 Renewals are approximately three weeks out.

26
27 Conditionals are being done within 24-48 hours.

28
29 Districts are working on the BEDS report which is due to the DE on November 4.

30
31 Financial Update:

32 The financial reports were reviewed for the FY 22 hold over as well as for August (FY
33 23).

1 Diane Dennis, Nicole Proesch and Kristi Traynor will be attending the NASDTEC
2 Professional Practices Institute (PPI) in Boise, ID next week. They will provide a report
3 to the board at the December board meeting.

4
5 NASDTEC Professional Educator Standards Board Association (PESBA). A conference
6 will be held December 12-13, 2022, at the Nevada Department of Education in Las
7 Vegas – Cavin will attend. A representative from the DE will be attending as well. The
8 conference will provide information on what other states are doing regarding
9 shortages, testing and apprenticeship programs.

10
11 The Legislative Reception will be held on Thursday, January 19, 2023, 7:30-9:00 a.m.,
12 in the Capitol Rotunda. It is an opportunity for our board members to interact with
13 legislators.

15 Nicole Proesch provided the Board with a presentation, “The Teacher Next Door.”

28 reciprocity laws. This proposed rulemaking implements the legislation.)

29

31 proposed amendment to IAC 282 Chapter 22 Work-Based Learning. **MOTION**
32 **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** (2022 Iowa Acts, SF 2383 directs the BoEE to create a

1 work-based learning program supervisor authorization. This proposed rulemaking
2 implements the legislation.)

3
4 Kristen Rickey moved, with a second by Erin Schoening, that the Board Notice the
5 proposed amendment to IAC 282 Chapter 14 Special Education. **MOTION CARRIED**
6 **UNANIMOUSLY.** (The proposed rulemaking will create an optional K-12 Special
7 Education – All endorsement.)

8
9 Kirsten Rickey moved, with a second by Erin Schoening, that the Board Notice the
10 proposed amendment to IAC 282 Chapter 13, applications from foreign institutions.
11 **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** (The proposed rulemaking would allow out-of-
12 country applicants to be exempt from Praxis testing if they hold a license in another
13 country or if their transcripts show the completion of a teacher preparation degree).

14
15 Kristen Rickey moved, with a second by Kathy Behrens, that the Board Notice the
16 proposed amendment to IAC 282 Chapter 22, content specialist authorization.
17 **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** (The proposed rulemaking would allow
18 candidates with a master’s degree or higher to obtain a content specialist
19 authorization).

20
21 Kristen Rickey moved, with a second by Eric St Clair, that the Board Notice the
22 proposed amendment to IAC 282 Chapter 27, professional service license, Class G
23 license. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** (The proposed rulemaking will change
24 the requirements for a Class G license to 75% of coursework completion.)

27 iJAG Proposal – A proposal was presented asking the BoEE to reduce the cost of the
28 iJAG Authorization from \$85 to \$40 to align the certification cost with that of the
29 Paraeducator. After reviewing the request, the Board chose not to move forward with
30 the reduction in fees.
